Gold Street Sober Living Home

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Good News Rescue Mission Gold Street Sober Living Home is a 4-bedroom, 2-bath, 2-story house that will shelter up to 7 individuals. Over the years, it will serve as a vital refuge for those beginning or continuing their journey to sobriety. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to everyone who contributed to this project, as its impact on the Redding community will be profound and long-lasting. Thank you for making this vision a reality.

CURRENT PROJECT STANDING

This sober living home is now complete. We have begun filling it with residents, with a waitlist currently in place. This property, once a graffiti-covered drug den frequented by the homeless, has been transformed into a safe, supportive home for men seeking recovery.

FUNDING

Although a majority of this project (purchase and remodel) is donor-funded, the City of Redding awarded a \$75,000 grant toward improvements from the Housing and Homeless Incentive Program (HHIP).

PERMIT

Occupancy Permit provided by City of Redding in December 2024.
